Confession and Absolution

Collect

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

First Reading: Wisdom 3.1-9 (*please sit*)

But the souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and no torment will ever touch them. ²In the eyes of the foolish they seemed to have died, and their departure was thought to be a disaster, ³and their going from us to be their destruction; but they are at peace. ⁴For though in the sight of others they were punished, their hope is full of immortality. ⁵Having been disciplined a little, they will receive great good, because God tested them and found them worthy of himself; ⁶like gold in the furnace he tried them, and like a sacrificial burnt-offering he accepted them. ⁷In the time of their visitation they will shine forth, and will run like sparks through the stubble. ⁸They will govern nations and rule over peoples, and the Lord will reign over them for ever. ⁹Those who trust in him will understand truth, and the faithful will abide with him in love, because grace and mercy are upon his holy ones, and he watches over his elect.

Psalm 23 (*please join in saying the text in **bold**, pausing shortly at the *asterisk*)

Refrain: I will dwell in the house of the Lord of ever.

The Lord is my shepherd;*

I shall not be in want.

**He makes me lie down in green pastures*
and leads me beside still waters.**

He revives my soul*

and guides me along right pathways for his name's sake.

Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I shall fear no evil;*
for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me.

You spread a table before me in the presence of those who trouble me;*

you have anointed my head with oil, and my cup is running over.

Surely your goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life,*
and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

Refrain: I will dwell in the house of the Lord of ever.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 1.3-9

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,⁴ and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,⁵ who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.⁶ In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials,⁷ so that the genuineness of your faith—being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire—may be found to result in praise and glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed.⁸ Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable and glorious joy,⁹ for you are receiving the outcome of your faith, the salvation of your souls.

Gospel Acclamation (*please stand*)



Gospel: John 6.37-40 (*please stand*) *When it is announced: Glory to Christ our Saviour.*

Everything that the Father gives me will come to me, and anyone who comes to me I will never drive away;³⁸ for I have come down from heaven, not to do my own will, but the will of him who sent me.³⁹ And this is the will of him who sent me, that I should lose nothing of all that he has given me, but raise it up on the last day.⁴⁰ This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life; and I will raise them up on the last day.'

Give thanks to the Lord for this glorious Gospel. **Praise to Christ our Lord.**

Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Lord of all, for, by your Cross, eternal life is ours and death is swallowed up in victory. In the first light of Easter glory broke from the tomb and brought the dead to new life. Before he was given up to suffering and death, Christ your Son taught his disciples of the life to come. At supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you." After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

We now obey your Son's command.
We recall his blessed passion and death,
his glorious resurrection and ascension;
and we look for the coming of his Kingdom.
Made one with him, we offer you these gifts
and with them ourselves,
a single, holy, living sacrifice.
