## The Rector's Letter

Dear all,

Easter is at the core of the Christian Faith as we ponder Christ's rising from the tomb in new life out of death and bringing joy out of grief. It is not surprising, therefore, that the celebration of Easter (and Holy Week leading up to it) have been central from the days of the Early Church onwards. Holy Week & Easter is, of course, still the most central observance for us here at Holy Trinity as we re-enter the drama and message of these most holy moments in the sacred time of our Church Year.

In order to arrive at Easter we need to journey through the happenings of Holy Week – from Palm Sunday and Jesus' entry into Jerusalem to the Last Supper and the sign of loving service in the washing of the disciples' feet; and from suffering and death on the cross to the realising of new life.

I notice, however, that it can be easy to stop journeying and either get stuck in a perpetual Good Friday or ignore its message altogether. Neither is helpful for Easter people. Yet, we may feel that we do not want to deal with suffering and pain or feel that we can see nothing but suffering in and around us – with no discernible way out.

Yet, Christ's sacrifice on the cross is so powerful not because of perfect suffering, but because of perfect love: Christ remains in love throughout, even in the face of suffering and pain which 'opens a door that no one can shut' (Revelation 3.8), allowing God's light to shine in all the world and us to walk in the knowledge of that perfect love which makes, redeems and inspires us always.

As we journey from the cross to the empty tomb and beyond into Easter joy, we may want to remember that love; that love which gives us breath and life; that love which invites us to join in with God in life; that love which sustains us and calls us to life and eventually out of this life to rise with Christ this Easter and always.

As George Herbert wrote:

Rise heart; thy Lord is risen. Sing his praise

Without delays,

Who takes thee by the hand, that thou likewise

With him mayst rise:

That, as his death calcined thee to dust,

His life may make thee gold, and much more, just.

## Report from Diocesan Synod

### The fruit of the Vine: Bishop's Charge to Diocesan Synod 2023

The Diocesan Synod took place on 11<sup>th</sup> March in St Ninian's Cathedral. Bishop Ian took as his theme John Chapter 15, which starts - 'I am the true vine and my Father is the gardener.....' He expanded on the passage and its relevance to the Diocese that, tended by God's love and seen as a whole, will flourish and bear fruit. He talked about the fact that as well as nurturing and feeding the vine, the gardener also had to plan for the seasons and prune where necessary. This set the agenda for thinking strategically and encouraging all charges to review and think about their 5-year planning for all aspects of their ministry. In addition to a presentation on the Net Zero Action Plan 23-30 Synod heard, and agreed to proposed changes to Canon 4 and the adoption of forms of Liturgy that have been in experimental use. Robert Nellist was especially thanked for his 12 years' service as the Diocesan Safeguarding Officer, a role that he has now handed on. Bishop Ian's PA, Carol Aitchison, is retiring and Synod warmly thanked her and wished her well in her future.

## **Evelyn Dimmer R.I.P.**

In the past three weeks we have received notice of a substantial legacy for Holy Trinity from Evelyn Dimmer's estate. Evelyn died on 21<sup>st</sup> September 2021 but as she had donated her body for medical research there was no funeral. For the last few months of her life Evelyn was cared for in a residential home in Bonnybridge. Prior to that she was at home ,extremely well supported by neighbours.

Evelyn was a member of Holy Trinity for approximately 40 years. She was a very active member, serving on the Vestry, organising the flowers and participating in many fund raising activities including a marathon walk around the church with her dog. She baked thousands of pancakes over the years and served teas in her garden along with other neighbours in Kennet Village to raise funds for various charities including Holy Trinity.

The garden was her pride and joy and she transformed it from a wasteland, which it was when she first moved to Kennet, to a beautiful oasis that she loved to share with others.

Evelyn cared for many friends and relatives over the years and she gave selflessly of her time to look after her friends at Holy Trinity.



Her faith was important to her and after she stopped driving she received communion at home.

She was a much loved member of the congregation and is sadly missed.

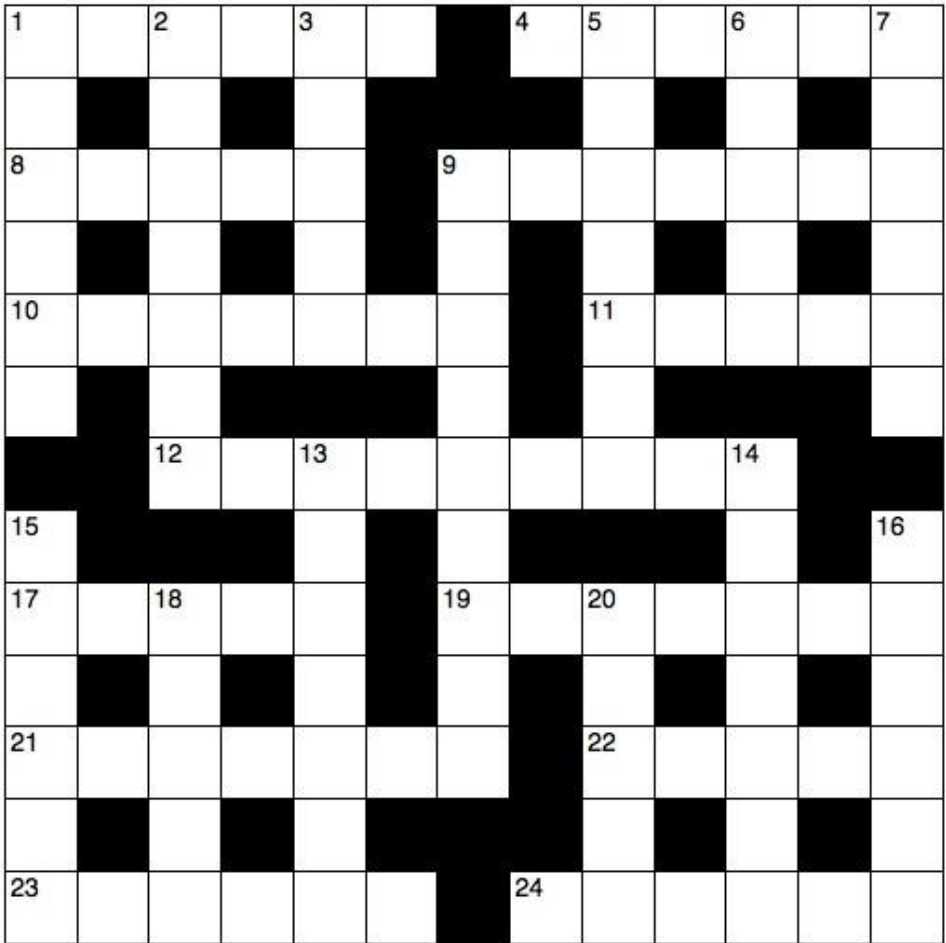

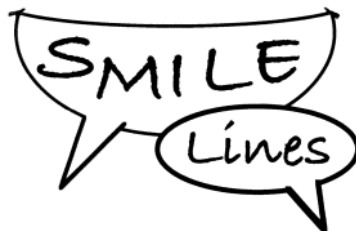
