



Imaginative Prayer at Holy Trinity

But we must also not forget that Holy Trinity is a place entrusted to us. As we perhaps feel the danger of losing our grounding, why not ground ourselves there in prayer and listen to what God might be saying to us today. Revisit as often as you like, Holy Trinity is still there for us!
